Morning Edition Cafe

Get a cup of joe from Key Coffee, a local roaster, tasty pancakes and waffles, or try one of the million different omelets that make it all worth the wait. O'Donnell Square, Canton

S. Linwood Ave & O'Donnell Streets

Head south on Linwood Ave. from the park and you'll find yourself in the middle of O'Donnell Square, with great nightlife, spas and restaurants galore. On your way there, stop by Saute (2844 Hudson, at Linwood) for a bite to eat—including great crab cakes—before hitting the bars on the Square.

Roman's

Tucked away on a narrow alley street, Roman's is home to one of the oldest family-owned bars in Baltimore. Offering \$1.50 Natty Bo, hand-padded oysters and homemade crab cakes, Roman presides over this neighborhood watering hole. Stop by on Fridays when sweet local ladies bring in free home baked desserts.

Salt

This New American tavern is a stone's throw from the western edge of the park. Its hip vibe, great wine, and innovative renderings of the classics makes this a perfect place to drink and dine.

Santoni's Supermarket

Tijuana Tacos

This taqueria is a hidden gem, offering authentic Mexican cuisine in a casual and friendly environment. The menus is loaded with authentic Mexican offerings, such as tacos filled with beef, chorizo or, for the more adventurous, tongue. A variety of burritos, tostadas, tortas and shakes round out the menu and are sure to please every palate. Try the flavored aguas, such as *agua sandia* (watermelon) or *agua pina* (pineapple) for a fresh summer treat. Open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, Tijuana Tacos is a great place for a quick bite or take-out.

Banner Neighborhoods Youth Programs

Patterson Park Public Charter School

Originally organized by parents and community members, PPPCS opened in September 2005 and is open to all city residents for grades K-8. The school is located at the former St. Elizabeth's Catholic School, and is currently undergoing an expansion to improve and modernize their facilities to create a state of the art learning environment. With the park as its epicenter, the school draws from surrounding neighborhoods in Southeast Baltimore.

Each year, the American Visionary Art Museum's Kinetic Sculpture Race runs, swims, flaps and claws its way through the city and into Patterson Park. Teams of volunteers operate a battery of homemade floats through a punishing obstacle course of sand, water, and Baltimore city potholes. Not to be missed, especially if you're into two-story-tall pink French poodles on wheels.

The Audubon Center has been actively involved in the community since 2002, providing education programming with schools, recreation centers, and after school programs in Patterson Park. The education staff also provides public programs, including bird walks, Tiny Tot programs, and family and adult programs in the Park for the community. PPAC serves six of the elementary schools around Patterson Park, three different after-school programs, as well as four Baltimore City Public High Schools. The Center has many partnerships with the community around the park and also hosts stewardship opportunities for the schools and surrounding communities.
